



Gevrey-Chambertin "En Créot"

AOC Gevrey-Chambertin "En Créot", Bourgogne, France

First vintage in 2020.

LOCATION

These vines were planted between 1950 and 1958 across 1.4 hectares to the northwest of the appellation in Brochon, in the continuation of the Gevrey valley.

TERROIR

The vines grow on shallow brown clay-limestone soil on scree-covered marl from the Gevrey valley, and red silt from the plateau. "Créot" means "chalk", which underscores the soil type here.

WINEMAKING

Harvesting is manual and the grapes are fully destalked because this limestone terroir alone is enough to bring mineral freshness to the wine.

VARIETAL

Pinot Noir 100%

TASTING

The chalky soil gives this wine a beautiful freshness. Its unique location brings a purity worthy of certain grand crus from this appellation.
